



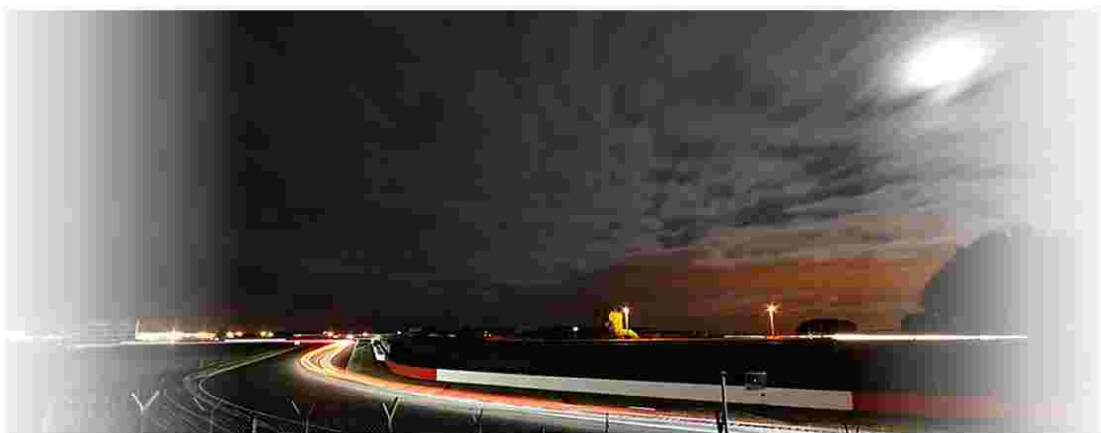
Lunar Racing is a non-profit making racing team. We compete at the highest levels of British Motorsport. However, our main goal isn't winning races or championships, it's teaching. We use the building and maintenance of real racing cars to teach motor vehicle qualifications.



The centre of everything we do is high quality lessons as we can't afford to do anything less. When a racing car has to brake from 150 mph before taking a hairpin bend at the limit of its tyres' grip, every component has to be fitted and maintained correctly. Because of this, our students are the best in the world. Our race teams are made up of 14-18 year old school children, but our cars have the best reliability records in every championship we enter.



In order to produce the best, we have to do more than simply teach mechanics, we have to work with the whole child. We truly believe 'in loco parentis' and because of this, when they graduate from Lunar Racing, our students are reliable, hard working, think independently and act responsibly, understand the value of knowledge and can work in high pressure situations. Oh yes, and have a Level 2 motor vehicle qualification equivalent to 5 GCSE's grade A* to C.





For Key Stage 4 students, we offer the IMI Level 2 Vehicle Maintenance, which gives students 100% contribution to the Level 2 threshold and 230 performance points (higher than the equivalent BTEC course). This is a good basic course, which we use as the basis of our teaching. However, in order to produce the best graduates we need to teach above and beyond the needs of the Level 2 syllabus. We are very unusual in that our students finish Key Stage 4 at a 'fully qualified' level, meaning they can either enter the workplace or further improve their CV's by taking a Level 3 course (leaving our care as very highly qualified 18 year olds).

For Key Stage 5 students, we again will only work with schools and so require our students to be a part of a sixth form. We offer a range of Level 3 courses which lead on from the IMI Level 2. Students will also be able to broaden their skills with a body repair course.



Our teaching facilities at Rockingham Motor Speedway include a well equipped workshop which will take groups of up to 16 pupils. Our air-conditioned classroom and computer room are located in the main stand and overlook the impressive Rockingham track. Not only do we have some of the best facilities in motor vehicle education, but we also have the best teachers and an excellent reputation in producing the best graduates in the country.

Level 2 Certificate in Vehicle Maintenance and Repair (Light Vehicle)

Qual Ref: 100/5568/X (LV)

Performance Figures: 100% Level 2 Threshold (5 A*-C), 230 points

This level 2 qualification covers the technical needs for today's motor vehicle repair industry, including the diagnosis of non-complex system faults. It provides essential knowledge for service technicians working on light vehicles (cars and vans) in all types of garages, dealerships, motorsport teams and maintenance depots.

It is a learning programme which involves students studying both the theory and practical aspects of the following:

- Carrying Out Routine Vehicle Maintenance
- Removing and Replacing: Engine units and components
- Electrical auxiliary units and components
- Chassis units and components

Students also gain a broad knowledge and understanding of health and safety in the workplace and other skills associated with working in a garage.

The student's knowledge is assessed by IMI Awards set practical assessments in the Lunar Racing workshop or at the race track; IMI Awards set 'on-line' multiple-choice testing and by assessments set by Lunar Racing.
